Egyptian's 70th Annual Meeting

gyptian Telephone Cooperative Association's 70th Annual Meeting of members was held Friday, August 9 at the American Legion in Steeleville. Members enjoyed pulled pork with all the fixings served by Sauced Up Smokers.

Board President David Ibendahl called the meeting to order and addressed various agenda items with the membership before inviting General Manager Matt Bollinger to the stage. Bollinger reported that four of the cooperative's seven exchanges are completely fiber to the home, and that the remaining customers who do not have fiber to the home in the Blair, Baldwin, and Glenn exchanges are scheduled for completion in the next few years.

He added that Egyptian Telephone has its advantages over its competitors, citing its dedication to service, its local employees and bill credits. "Your board of directors authorized over \$250,000 to be returned as capital credits," Bollinger said. "We're very, very proud of the fact that we can distribute capital credits."

During the meeting, members reelected directors Greg Alfeldt (Oakdale), Sue Wennemann (St. Libory), and Curtis Wolf (Venedy) to 3-year terms by acclamation.

After adjournment, prizes were given away to members present at the meeting.
