*Subscriber must be switched to Egyptian Long Distance for both local toll and long distance services. Time frame for free calling is 7/1/25-7/31/25. Plan applies solely to voice calls terminating within the continental U.S. Plan does not apply to calls for Internet access services, calling card services, operator assisted calls, collect calls, third number calls, calls to international numbers, incoming 800 calls, calls to 900 numbers, directory assistance, operator services, and preferred plus calling. Non-qualifying calls are subject to additional charges at Egyptian's then current rate.

Nominating Committee meets

The members appointed to the 2025 Nominating Committee met Thursday, June 5, 2025. The purpose of the meeting was to nominate candidates for two director positions that will expire this year at the 71st Annual Meeting.

Mr. Arbeiter reviewed cooperative bylaws and policies pertaining to the committee's responsibilities and duties from nominating candidates. Frank Kocian was elected chairman and Lloyd Kranawetter was elected secretary. After discussion, the committee nominated the following candidates from the Rice and Glenn exchanges. Foundation for Rural Service Awards College Scholarships to Students in Rural Communities

The Foundation for Rural Service (FRS) announced that it has awarded a total of \$160,500 in college scholarships to 50 students across the country. The FRS scholarship program awards one-time scholarships to students from rural communities for their first year of college, university, or vocational-technical school. Each student is sponsored by an NTCA member company that may also contribute a portion of the scholarship award.

FRS Scholarships. Courtney was chosen to receive a \$2,000 scholarship from the Foundation, plus a \$500 match from Egyptian Telephone Cooperative. Courtney plans to attend Illinois College. Egyptian is proud to be a member of NTCA and support the Foundation through these programs.

FRS has awarded over \$1 million in scholarships since its inception; empowering rural students throughout the country to advance their communities with invaluable skill sets and experiences.

FUSC charge Effective on your August 2025 statement, the amount of your Federal Universal Service Charge (FUSC) appearing on your bill each month will change in the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's) universal service fund contribution factor from 36.6% to 36.0%. The federal universal service fund is designed to help keep local telephone service rates affordable for all customers in all areas of the United States.
